Skipped Police Bureau report, no rep.

Katie: grant applications still being accepted, there are \$10G in grants. Umpqua and Neil Kelly are sponsoring discounted energy audits; review of upcoming NECN events.

Teri: sent a letter to Quicktrip, met with Scott from Safeway. Teri will approach the car wash as well, given the recent shooting. Spoke with police regarding crime issues (Commander Leeloff (sp?)). Police are concerned that last Thursday continues to be an expensive problem.

Brief discussion of Last Thursday and potential efforts for Friends of last Thursday to become a non-profit organizer with a permit and able to charge fees.

Alan re backpack lunch program: The program costs \$100/year per child. KNA has agreed to start a program at King to supplement the regular program. It would use the KNA 501(c)3 status in order to fundraise with donors unwilling to donate to a church. Hopeful to have approval next week.

Rock the Vote this Sunday at Portland Playhouse. KNA volunteers welcome. Alan will be teaching the Thriller dance for those who want to participate this year, Sat 27th at OMSI.

7-11 offered a good neighbor plan that was addressed to another neighborhood. Input from neighbors was submitted to 7-11. All liquor licenses north of Burnside are up for renewal on December 6th of each year. Complaints regarding a licensed entity can be made online.

Jeff: annual report due to the Sec of State will go out tomorrow. Papers of incorporation were filed in 2010. Need to file information on Board Members.

Andrew: Land Use Committee updating its priorities and projects. Recently developers of smaller projects have approached the KNA with plans.

Joshua came to ask KNA to endorse the PPS bond ballot measure. He described the measure and answered questions. KNA is not endorsing.

Karen: police sirens on MLK are disturbing the sleep of residents.
