Hacienda CDC

Check with them to see if their kitchen at the Blazer's Club could be made available to the Franklin Family Foundation to use for their annual holiday dinner. Check to see if Alberta Abbey would be willing to help host. Action item: John K.

Franklin Family Foundation Holiday Dinner

Laverne gave an update on ongoing planning for this program, which the KNA has supported in past, both with a donation of funds as well as helping to staff this dinner that feeds families during the holiday.

Outstanding:

- Was still evaluating if the dinner this year would be back to in-person or it would be
 a boxed meal handout. That will determine which kind of location is needed, or it
 could be that available locations could predetermine which kind of dinner could be
 hosted. In-person dinners that served a hot meal in past typically ran 600 people
 fed. Last year's pandemic box meal handout for families saw 200 family dinners
 handed out.
- Still needs a location. Last year, the dinner was a box handout coordinated from the facilities of one of our local churches.
- Still determining if the dinner will be timed more for Thanksgiving or Christmas
- Toys have been a component for past Christmas dinners

• Contact nearby venues, such as the Boys and Girls Club and the Alberta Abbey, to see if they could help host and/or offer kitchen facilities for cooking
